'The central purpose of the Criminal Justice System is to deliver an efficient, effective, accountable and fair justice process for the public.' A similar tone was set by the 'Policy Green Paper' published in early March 2008 by the Conservative Party, entitled 'Prisons with a purpose'. Criminal justice. The criminal justice system is a series of government agencies and institutions whose goal is to identify and catch the law-breakers and to inflict a form of punishment on them. Other goals include the rehabilitation of offenders, preventing other crimes, and moral support for victims. In such circumstances a discussion of punishment in Criminal Justice Matters is timely. This issue grew out of seminar, hosted in June 2005, by the Crime and Society Foundation, which is based at the Centre for Crime and Justice Studies.
